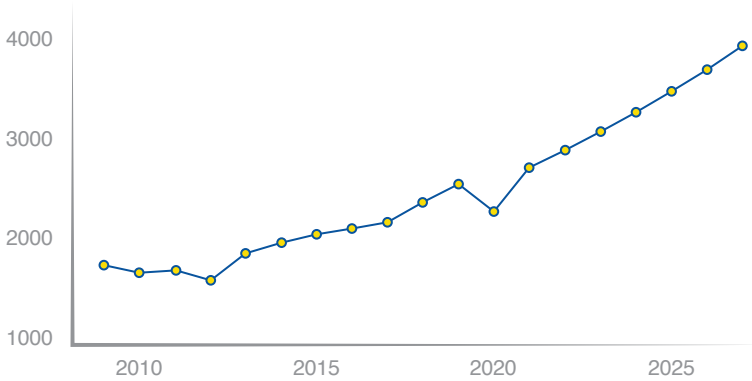

What's The Deal?

Calls for service to Grand County EMS continue to rapidly increase and are projected to double by 2027 compared to 2015.



We need to hire 6 additional staff members over the next few years, and retain more of our existing staff to keep medical training costs down and to continue to respond quickly to emergencies.

We have one World War II era building and another built in 1953 that are becoming unsafe to work in - both of these stations, located in Granby and Fraser must be rebuilt.

A new ambulance is needed by next year and we must replace three of our aging ambulances within the next 3 to 5 years to keep response times low, be cost effective, and ensure the safety of our patients and staff.

How Can We Solve This?

The most efficient and cost-effective way to fund these staffing, infrastructure, and equipment needs is to consider an increased mill levy on property, which constituents would get to vote on.

Raising the local property tax mill levy by 1.75 mills would provide an estimated \$1.65 million annually to be spent on staffing, buildings and vehicles needed to serve Grand County safely, efficiently and effectively.

The proposed mill levy increase depends on your home value. A \$500,000 home would be taxed an additional \$62 each year (\$5 per month if you have an escrow account on your mortgage).

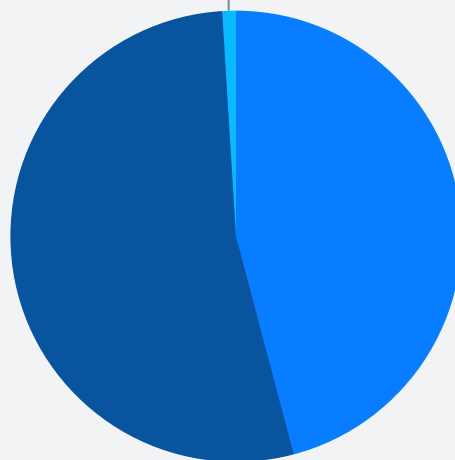
A 1.75 mill levy increase would add about \$5 per month in property taxes on a \$500,000 home

Who Pays For Our Emergency Medical Services In Grand County?

1% Grants & Other

55% Patient Service Fees

Fees paid by patients who use our services account for 55% of the 2021 budget at \$1.9 million



44% Property Taxes

Property taxes currently at 2 mills provide about 44% of the 2021 budget at \$1.6 million
