East Grand School District No. 2 Director District 6 - Term of four years (Vote for One)	Shall there be a change to the Colorado Revised Statutes concerning property tax reductions, and, in connection therewith, reducing property tax revenue by an estimated \$1.03 billion in 2023 and by comparable amounts thereafter by reducing the residential property tax assessment rate from 7.15% to 6.5% and reducing the property tax assessment rate for all other property, excluding producing mines and lands or leaseholds producing oil or gas, from 29% to 26.4% and allowing the state to annually retain and spend up to \$25 million of excess state revenue, if any, for state fiscal years 2022-23 through 2026-27 as a voter-approved revenue change to offset lost revenue resulting from the property tax rate reductions and to reimburse local governments for revenue lost due to the homestead exemptions for qualifying seniors and disabled veterans? <input type="radio"/> YES/FOR <input type="radio"/> NO/AGAINST	Grand County Ballot Question 1B

Ballot questions referred by the general assembly or any political subdivision are listed by letter, and ballot questions initiated by the people are listed numerically. A ballot question listed as an "amendment" proposes a change to the Colorado constitution, and a ballot question listed as a "proposition" proposes a change to the Colorado Revised Statutes. A "yes/for" vote on any ballot question is a vote in favor of changing current law or existing circumstances, and a "no/against" vote on any ballot question is a vote against changing current law or existing circumstances.

Amendment 78 (CONSTITUTIONAL)		
Shall there be an amendment to the Colorado Constitution and a change to the Colorado Revised Statutes concerning money that the state receives, and, in connection therewith, requiring all money received by the state, including money provided to the state for a particular purpose, known as custodial money, to be subject to appropriation by the general assembly after a public hearing; repealing the authority to disburse money from the state treasury by any other means; requiring all custodial money to be deposited into the newly created custodial funds transparency fund and the earnings on those deposits to be transferred to the general fund; and allowing the state to retain and spend all custodial money and earnings and revenue on that custodial money as a voter-approved revenue change? <input type="radio"/> YES/FOR <input type="radio"/> NO/AGAINST

East Grand School District No. 2 Ballot Issue 4A

SHALL EAST GRAND SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 2 DEBT BE INCREASED \$85 MILLION, WITH A REPAYMENT COST OF UP TO \$159.5 MILLION, AND SHALL DISTRICT TAXES BE INCREASED UP TO \$7.1 MILLION ANNUALLY FOR THE FOLLOWING PURPOSES:

- SAFETY, SECURITY AND ADA COMPLIANCE UPGRADES AT ALL FACILITIES;
- PHYSICAL IMPROVEMENTS AND RENOVATIONS AT FRASER VALLEY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, EAST GRAND MIDDLE SCHOOL AND MIDDLE PARK HIGH SCHOOL;
- PROVIDING A FACILITY FOR NEW CAREER AND TECHNICAL SKILLS PROGRAMS;
- CONSTRUCTING A NEW GRANBY ELEMENTARY SCHOOL WITH ROOM FOR FUTURE GROWTH;
- PROVIDING SPACE FOR STUDENT MENTAL HEALTH COUNSELING AND SCHOOL NURSE SERVICES;
- ACQUIRING LAND;

AND TO THE EXTENT FUNDS ARE AVAILABLE EXERCISING A LEASE PURCHASE OPTION AND ACQUIRING, CONSTRUCTING AND REPAIRING DISTRICT CAPITAL ASSETS, BY THE ISSUANCE AND PAYMENT OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS WHICH SHALL BEAR INTEREST, MATURE, BE SUBJECT TO REDEMPTION, WITH OR WITHOUT PREMIUM, AND BE ISSUED AT SUCH TIME, AT SUCH PRICE (AT, ABOVE OR BELOW PAR) AND IN SUCH MANNER AND CONTAINING SUCH TERMS, NOT INCONSISTENT WITH THIS BALLOT ISSUE, AS THE BOARD OF EDUCATION MAY DETERMINE; AND SHALL AD VALOREM PROPERTY TAXES BE LEVIED WITHOUT LIMIT AS TO THE MILL RATE NOT INCONSISTENT WITH THE COST PARAMETERS SET FORTH ABOVE AND IN AN AMOUNT SUFFICIENT IN EACH YEAR TO PAY THE PRINCIPAL OF, PREMIUM IF ANY, AND INTEREST ON SUCH DEBT AND TO FUND ANY RESERVES FOR THE PAYMENT THEREOF?
