WINTER CODE OF CONDUCT

Grand County Road & Bridge is dedicated to clearing the roads of snow to allow safe passage for the traveling public. Please remember that obstructing a County Road by plowing snow on or across the County Right-of-Way is not allowed per state law. Please remember that a property owner may be liable for any injury attributable to a hazard that they have created in a public Right-of-Way.

Other reminders to help us and you:

- Parking any vehicle or trailer in the County Right-of-Way is not allowed and vehicles and/or trailers are subject to tickets and/or towing.
- Placing roll offs or dumpsters in the County Right-of-Way is not allowed. The County is not liable for any damage to trash containers in the County Right-of-Way.
- PLEASE DO NOT ALLOW CHILDREN TO PLAY ON THE EDGE OF THE ROAD IN THE SNOW BERMS (i.e. tunneling, snow caves etc...).
- A snow berm may accumulate in front of your driveway due to plowing.
- Generally, half of the snow on the road belongs to the property owners on either side of the road.
- Primary roads will have first priority during heavy snowfall with secondary roads being cleared as soon as possible thereafter.
