



Licensed Radon Contractors

Radon is a naturally occurring radioactive gas that is common in Colorado homes. It is the second leading cause of lung cancer, only beat by smoking cigarettes. The best way to protect you and your family from radon is by doing a radon test and doing radon mitigation if the results of the tests are high.

As of July 2022, radon mitigation contractors in Colorado are required to be licensed through the State Department of Regulatory Affairs (DORA). With radon being such a big issue in Colorado, there has been a problem with uneducated and unqualified individuals representing themselves as radon professionals and doing subpar mitigation work that doesn't fix high radon levels in homes. This license requirement was designed to fix that issue and give customers the comfort of knowing that their contractor is qualified to install a functioning system.

Below is a list of radon mitigation contractors that are licensed through DORA and have indicated that they do radon mitigation work in Grand County. This is not a comprehensive list and there are other contractors in the state that are licensed who may do work in Grand County.
